## **Financial Report**

At the Board Meeting on the 5<sup>th</sup> September our treasurer, Peter Watson, reported that donations to the church had increased by approximately 12% compared to last year which is in line with our rededication service held in the autumn last year. Costs were similar to last year and were within our 2018 budget.

Unfortunately, we had to replace the gutters and downpipes at the rear of the Church at an unbudgeted cost of £1,800 which will be met from the Fabric Fund. We must also be prepared for a significant repair to the roughcasting at the gable end of the hall which will also eat into our reserves.
